Meeting Minutes

Monday, June 18, 2018

1. Presentation

a. SFPUC – Creation of New Flood Maps for SF

Sara Minnick, waste water enterprise for SFPUC. Their team works on flood resilience, mitigating flood risk, and flood water management.

i. Flood map found online: sfwater.org/floodmaps

ii. Map includes

1. properties that have had 6 inches (over a curb) or more of flooding, based on “100-year flood” models (which is 2.5 inches, but can accumulate differently in different areas based on topography.)
2. more than ½ block
3. modeling includes modeling for sea level rising w/climate change. (Sea level rises to 2050.)

iii. Commission Hearing

will be held to hear thoughts, suggestions, concerns. This will form final map in September, and then will be legislative efforts to create disclosure requirements for anyone who sells their property and is in a flood zone.

iv. Grant Programs:

1. Grant program for any place that can show flooding, even if not in designated flood zone on map. Grants include money for flood-proofing projects, dry-proofing, etc.
2. Public projects; can apply for grants for rain harvesting, removing impervious surfaces
3. Do not currently have programs to provide for permeable driveways.

v. Misc:

1. Anything property that develops 5k or more structures (normally over 2 typical plots), must build on-site water management structures. There is a whole menu of options (ex> rain garden, permeable pavement, green roofs, rain barrels, etc.) Typically, it is less than 1% of the project cost. There is a technical assistance team that can help with this.
2. Pipes going into Alemany should *help* (but *not solve*) reduce amount of flood water.

3. These projects are \$500M in investments for 5-year 3-hour storms... not the 100-year storms.
